Do it or die

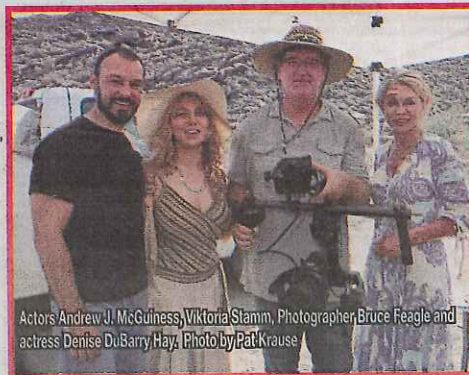
